As we start a new program year, I wanted to let everyone know about some new steps that are going to be part of my job as your Treasurer. The main push for this next year is to provide information so all of the congregation understands our current financial situation and what can be done. Here are a few steps that I will be starting with:



- Provide up to date financial information to the membership via the newsletter. I would have had something for you this month, but the handoff of the books has not happened as of the time I wrote this.
- · Post current financial information at the church on a bulletin board. I will attempt to update it every two weeks so we all have access to up to date information.
- We will continue to hold quarterly meetings about the budget (see the note below).
- There will also be a meeting in late summer about how to read the church financials and understand the budget. I have heard from some that they would like to offer feedback to the budget, but have a hard time making sense of it all.
- Provide reports types based on request. If you see a report, graph or any other type of financial representation and have a suggestion for more clarity, let me know. We can always strive to provide better information.

With all the projects our church has planned over the next few years, we must all take part in understanding the finances of the church. The budget and the financial reports are not something that is exclusive to the councils needs. They are created to meet your needs and help you decide how you can best meet the needs of the church.

The town hall meeting for the budget is scheduled for July 19th between services. Hope to see you all there.

INSTALLATION: The Installation of our Pastor Randy followed in the afternoon. SOV was filled with friends, family, and Pastors. The food and flowers were very elegant and most folks remained to enjoy the reception. Our refugee youth and the Soggy Bottom Beaver Dam Boy's performed. Thanks to Betty Stoltenburg for the invitations; to Carol Husk, Connie McFall, and Tammy McDonald who organized the reception; to Marlene Loftus, Pat Nelson, Ann Smith, and Beth Kight for the advance cleaning; to Jim Tabor and his sound system/set up/take down folks; Lloyd Huber-Dilbeck for pictures, and to others who pitched in as needed. It is a new beginning!!

ANNUAL MEETING: Our annual meeting was well attended. Elections were completed and the congregation passed two resolutions authorizing the Executive Council to proceed with the deck/fire escape project. Council plans to continue **town hall meetings** regularly in order to keep communication flowing with the next meeting scheduled for **July 19th**. More specific's will be announced. A pizza and salad lunch was provided but, as an FYI, the free will offering was over \$100 short of covering the cost of the food.

COUNCIL: On Thursday evening, the new Council met and endorsed the contract with Dave Saalfeld with modifications. The siding on the north wall of the kitchen has dry rot and so will be removed for repair and replacement. More problems may be revealed. At that time an upgrade on the kitchen window will be completed since there is the best access to that window at that time. Our message to Dave is to deal with problems that are revealed in the deck area. The additional cost is approximately \$3,000. We will keep you informed or ask Council members as needed. The contract will be available for member review upon request.

The Council scheduled a **retreat** for **Saturday**, **August 8**th **beginning at 9 AM**. The location and agenda are to be planned. The Council discussed general training issues, safety issues as it relates to the building, staff, and members, long term planning (bringing back the old and updating to new), and leadership training open for the congregation. Hopefully, committee's will get meetings scheduled and any new Council rep's decided soon.

SUMMARY: I will be limiting my reports to one page – so hitting the highlights. I encourage all to review the Council minutes, the weekly bulletins and the newsletter to keep informed.


Camp Lutherwood staff will join us this year with their SHINE program, materials and enthusiasm to teach our children.
